Grace — God's Gift To Us

With a hammer in one hand and a large scroll under his arm, Martin Luther approached the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany. He took a couple of nails from his dark woolen habit and began pounding his 95 theses to the church's heavy wooden doors. The date was October 31, 1517 and the event changed the course of human history. Luther's protest was against the Catholic Church which was the supreme authority in the land: those who went against the Church did so at the peril of their lives. What prompted this act of courage and defiance on Luther's part? As Luther studied Scripture, his eyes were opened to a new concept: the concept of God's grace. Passion burned inside him as he read verses like Ephesians 2:8-9: "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can boast." (NIV)

The established Church in Luther's day misled people into thinking they could only be saved by their own works through pilgrimages, confessions and by purchasing indulgences, which were basically "get out of hell free" cards. It became clear to Luther that men could not purchase God's grace: it was freely given. This conviction led him to write out his "theses," which he nailed to the door of the church in Wittenberg.

Out of this "protest" came the Protestant Church which over the next three centuries revolutionized Western Civilization. Out of this came our freedom from believing we have to earn our salvation through works, pilgrimages and even "payments" to the church. Martin Luther paved the way for us all to receive God's free gift of salvation—not earned, lest any man boast. If salvation could be earned, Jesus would not have had to suffer and die on a cross. If we could work our way to heaven, he would not have shed His blood for us. But he knew we could never earn our salvation.

"Jesus told them, 'This is the only work God wants from you: Believe in the one he has sent'." John 6:29

God offers us a true gift, we can all receive it because nothing is required except to BELIEVE.

Receive and celebrate your gift of salvation this Christmas season. Share this gift with others who are feeling condemned, broken and who are suffering under the heavy weight of oppression. Jesus came to set the captives free. BE FREE and enjoy God's gift of salvation through the blood of Jesus Christ.

Now that is something to celebrate!
