After Tim came to live at the men's On Wings of Hope House we all got tickled when he kept saying, "That's what God do!" We love to hear him say it and we ourselves find we repeat the phrase often.

A few weeks ago, I met in the On Wings Prayer Room with Gary Byrum, a dear friend for over thirty years. He served in leadership in my church for much of that time. His Godly reputation and loyal character did not escape my notice, but I can tell you I never dreamed that God had a plan to bring us together in service to Him.

It began at a women's conference I attended with my friend Barbara, that I almost did not attend. The table filled quickly and my friend's wife sat beside me. How Firm a Foundation

The Tuesday Bible Study Group has been studying the book of Nehemiah. Nehemiah was a Hebrew, who served as cupbearer to Persian King Artaxerxes during the time that the conquered

Hebrew people were exiled to Persia. After the Temple was rebuilt in Jerusalem under priest Ezra's leadership, Nehemiah felt burdened because the city's protective walls remained destroyed, leaving his beloved city vulnerable. Nehemiah discerned God leading him to return to Jerusalem to take charge of the work to rebuild the walls. This book is God's account of the rebuilding process.

Nehemiah Chapter 8 details the many people involved in rebuilding Jerusalem's wall. The wall had to be built on a firm and sure foundation, and the people worked together to ensure that there were no gaps in the wall. It is worth noting the dimensions of this wall, which had been originally built by King Hezekiah: 25 feet high, 22 feet thick(!), 2.5 miles long; it was rebuilt in only 52 days! This huge wall was not constructed by one person, but by a community, working together under Godordained leadership.

How similar this is to my life with my Christian brothers and sisters. We are building our lives on the firm and sure foundation of Jesus Christ, who is our Cornerstone (Ephesians 2: 19-22). When I need help continuing to build, or the wall comes under attack and starts to be shaken, a sister or brother steps in to help bear my load.

How do I build on the foundation that is laid in Jesus Christ? By spending daily time in the Word of God (II Timothy 3:16-17), by spending time in prayer throughout each day (I Thessalonians 5:16-18) and by actively involved in a community of fellow believers for support, encouragement, exhortation and accountability (Hebrews 10:24-25).

God's graciousness and faithfulness is clearly evident throughout the book of Nehemiah. The people responded with joy, mourning, confession of sins and renewing their relationship with the LORD God

Your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

Matthew 6:4

Every day, Glen purchases his morning coffee at a nearby drive-through. And every day he also pays for the order of the person in the car behind him, asking the cashier to wish that person a good day. Glen has no connection to them. He's not aware of their reactions; he simply believes this small gesture is "the least he can do." On one occasion, however, he learned of the impact of his actions when he read an anonymous letter to the editor of his local newspaper. He discovered that the kindness of his gift on July 18, 2017, caused the person in the car behind him to reconsider their plans to take their own life later that day.

Glen gives daily to the people in the car behind him without receiving credit for it. Only on this single occasion did he get a glimpse of the impact of his small gift. When Jesus says we should "not let [our] left hand know what [our] right hand is doing" (Matthew 6:3), He's urging us to give—as Glen does—without need for recognition. When we give out of our love for God, without concern for receiving the praise of others, we can trust that our gifts—large or small—will be used by Him to help meet the needs of those receiving them.
