Each time a new resident comes to make On Wings of Hope their home for a season we have a welcome home celebration for them. What a blessing it is to gather together with our Board Members, their mentors, and all the residents from both houses as we come to break bread together.

The women's house has a large kitchen and den space that make it perfect for gathering. As I thought about the transformation of the house, I was reminded that each resident who enters the house is in the process of transformation. When we walked into the women's house in the beginning it looked like it needed to be torn down to the natural eye, but we could see the vision of what it could become. Now we just sit on the couch and look around in amazement of the improvements and how the dilapidated house has become a home.

We believe that our residents are also in the process of transformation, and they may often look desolate and not worth the effort of restoring them to become like the garden of Eden as stated in our passage. But the Lord goes on to say He will till the land until it does become like the Garden, He created it to be, He has spoken it and He will do it. So, we look forward to how we will be privileged to watch Him do just that as He renews, heals, and restores what might look desolate to most but is redeemable to Him. We see His vision for each one and believe He will do the work He needs to do. Oh, what a privilege it is to be a small part of what He is doing.

As we have grown there are more and more residents to laugh, share stories, and express God's love with. We are a family, and we sense there have been strong bonds made with each other and we anticipate that happening with our new residents as well.

Kristen is our latest arrival, and we are looking forward to getting to know her and helping her grow in her relationship with the Lord. As Velma sat with her recently, she asked her what her goals were. She said, "the first one is to be saved". Needless to say, Velma led her right then and there to accept Christ, repent of her sins and receive the Holy Spirit into her heart. Now as she reads the Word it will become clearer to her, and we pray she will hear Him speak to her and guide her in the paths He has for her life.

The ladies are involved in a weekly Bible Study with the OWOH Women's Director, they are also attending our Tuesday Women's Bible Study as we learn about the subject of anger, and they attend Celebrate Recovery on Tuesday nights. We are incorporating other learning opportunities as well. This week they will begin attending a class entitled Seven Habits and on completion they will receive a certificate of completion. Each opportunity of instruction is preparing them for life and designed to make them into the vessel He will use in the future.

Each resident of our homes has a personal assigned mentor who walks the journey with them and are available for the resident for guidance, transportation, and spiritual counsel. Each of us need a mentor and I am so grateful for mine over the years. Having a mentor to walk beside you is priceless.
