God's Vision for 2023.

"And the Lord said to me, "Write my answer on a billboard, large and clear, so that anyone can read it at a glance and rush to tell the others. But these things I plan don't happen right away. Slowly, steadily, surely, the time approaches when the vision will be fulfilled. If it seems slow, do not despair, for these things will surely come to pass. Just be patient! They will not be overdue a single day!" Habakkuk 2:2-3

This passage has been quoted frequently. The vision for On Wings has developed over the years into vision beyond our expectations which is only orchestrated by God. One of our board members, Bryan Milleson, wrote out a vision for the future which he called, Family Restoration Center. I have that plan from 2017 tucked in the pocket of my notebook and I take it out once in a while and just review and pray over it. As the passage says, sometimes our dreams don't happen overnight, so we must remain patient.

The dictionary defines vision as an act or power of anticipating which will or may come to be. Vision gives direction for our future and how we travel our journey with God's will in view. His vision for my life and that of His ministry through me needs to be clear, not fuzzy. So sometimes He needs to correct my spiritual vision with new lens from His Word just like what I need physically to see more clearly.

We love our office but after 9 years here we sense that there is need for a larger space with all our ministry efforts under one roof. We are privileged to have close access to those spaces, but our goal is to have our operations under one roof. We long for a large space to have larger groups meet for Bible Study, worship, and fellowship. We would like to have a full kitchen in order to have events in the facility and to have gatherings for our families and the residents of On Wings of Hope Houses and their families. This might be a huge dream, but we know God can make dreams become reality. We are trusting, believing, and looking to see how He will bring it all together.

As my body ages I find myself with physical vision limitations. At my recent visit at the eye Dr. I was told I have cataracts on both eyes that will require surgery. So that is why I am having such difficulty seeing, especially with bright lights and glare. Just as I must tend to my personal vision I must tend to my spiritual vision as well and I must depend upon God to give it to me.

Ready or not, it's 2023! Oh, the start of a new year brings with it

new hopes, new plans, new resolutions. How many times have I started a new year with abundant plans – what I would do, or things I would not do. My plans always dwindle as I realize that I just can't count on myself to make it happen.

A few years ago I started a practice of claiming a "word" for the year. For example, I've claimed "triumphant" and "faithful"; last year my word was "trust". I clung to my word through dark nights and upsetting days, knowing that I can trust God with all I cannot see or understand. This year's word is Emmanuel, "God with us". No matter what is happening or what I am facing, God is with me. I cannot count on myself to be consistent or do what I say, but I can count on God, and He has promised – He is Emmanuel.

In the December Praver Support Meeting and Tuesday afternoon Bible study we explored and practiced "breath prayers" - short, often one- or two-word prayers that are said along with slow, deep breaths. The purpose of breath prayers is to slow down and refocus. Such prayer is an avenue to actively acknowledge, submit to and rely upon God's presence in our busy, chaotic and often fretful lives, and to find peace thereby. I practiced breath prayers during my Christmas shopping! "Emman...uel", repeating the Name over and over again. What a sweet and powerful reminder. What a blessing and a promise. What a Savior! Emmanuel – God with us.

As we start this new year with renewed hopes and dreams, as we carry some of the burden and pains of last year into the new year, as trials, disappointments and fears arise anew, how grateful I am to know that God is with me – and that His mercies are new every morning (and every new year) – "great is Thy faithfulness!" (see Lamentations 3:22-23) "Abide in Me, and I in you.... - Jesus in John 15:4

Prayer Thoughts

God's Sure Pursuit

Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life. Psalm 23:6

Some years ago, a man walked about a block ahead of me. I could clearly see that his arms were full of packages. All of a sudden, he tripped, dropping everything. A couple of people helped him to his feet, assisting him in collecting what he'd dropped. But they missed something—his wallet. I picked it up and took off in hot pursuit of the stranger, hoping to return that important item. I yelled "Sir, sir!" and finally got his attention. He turned just as I reached him. As I held out the wallet, I'll never forget his look of surprised relief and immense gratitude.

What began as following after that man turned into something quite different. Most English translations use the word follow in the final verse of the familiar Psalm 23 —"Surely your goodness and love will follow me" (v. 6). And while "follow" fits, the actual Hebrew word used is more forceful, aggressive even. The word literally means "to pursue or chase," much like a predator pursues his prey (think of a wolf pursuing sheep).

God's goodness and love don't merely follow along after us at a casual pace, in no real hurry, like a pet might leisurely follow you home. No, "surely" we are being pursued—chased even—with intention. Much like pursuing a man to return his wallet, we're pursued by the Good Shepherd who loves us with an everlasting love

- We have 2 Transition Houses up and running just this year..and they are fully furnished by donors
- We received another grant for the houses.
- We were donated 2 ministry vehicles, one for the men and one for the women.
- One of our residents was able to secure another vehicle under his name which was donated.
- We had a closed trailer donated to assist us with outreaches.
- We secured a Resource Center close to us giving us the ability to store and prepare distribution of donated items for both our Residents, the houses, and the Community.
- Gary Byrum came on as our Logistics Coordinator which has been a true blessing to us.
 We have been able to send in over 1000 Study Bibles to Prisoners and Bible Correspondence Courses.
- Everyone of our 6 Residents have a job and are contributing back to On Wings of Hope
- We have both a Men's and Women's Hope House Administrator in place. A Men's and Women's Hope House Director for both houses. And each Resident has a personal Mentor which is coordinated by our Mentor Coordinator.
- We have had a busy year with developing guidelines and OWOH house procedures.
- We were able to secure Insurance for our Houses and Office Property which was a difficult task.
- We have given out a few hundred Treasure Boxes to prisoners, children and in underprivileged communities in our city. We reached in at least four times this year with different outreaches.
- We have continued to minister to families of Prodigals and Prisoners and have more vision for the future.
- God has connected us with churches and organizations in ways we have only dreamed of in past years. We have actually had church groups contacting us to help with our outreaches.
- We have at least 3 of our group who will be baptized soon. One came to know the Lord on her arrival to OWOH and others have rededicated their lives and want to be baptized.
