As Elizabeth shared about the middle of the page exercise, I went back to Chapel Hill in my mind sitting on a hill outside in the spring air with my colored piece of paper and coloring pens. I was thinking---this is crazy, but as God began to download, I found myself writing down the answers to my questions as He spoke to my spirit or as He took me to a passage of scripture which spoke to my question.

When I was finished, I said, "wow", this wasn't so crazy after all. I went out and bought a pad of colored paper and have been searching for answers ever since in the middle of the page. It is a great tool and our ladies found it to be true as well.

We enjoyed Helen leading us in worship before each session in her soft, gentle way. We loved hearing her blow the shofar and describing its origin and significance. I believe when the Word talks about the sound of the trumpet to call us up with Him the shofar is what will be blown.

God blessed us during our time away as we learned more about the importance of realigning our spirit, soul, and body with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We also learned the importance of blessing others and ourselves.

I am so grateful for all who participated by answering His call to "Come to Him" for the weekend and receive. It means to come and keep on coming. Does it amaze you as much as it does me that the King of the universe invites us to come to Him?

Before the Retreat I was reading Hosea 6:1-2, "Come and let us return to the Lord; for He has torn so that He may heal us; He has stricken so that He may bind us, give us life; on the third day He will raise us up, that we may live before Him".

AND WHENEVER THE RAINBOW APPEARS IN THE CLOUDS,

I WILL SEE IT AND REMEMBER THE

EVERLASTING COVENANT BETWEEN GOD AND EVERY LIVING

CREATURE OF EVERY KIND THAT IS ON THE EARTH.

GENESIS 9:16



Does the rainbow have a meaning? What is the biblical significance of the rainbow?

The rainbow has gained popularity in recent years as certain ideological groups have adopted it as their logo. However, God has already assigned meaning to this atmospheric beauty. In Scripture, the presence of a rainbow was a message from God; in fact, God says it is "my bow" (Genesis 9:13)—it belongs to Him.

The first rainbow appears after the flood. God was speaking to Noah, giving him some commands and promises. God said, "I have set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth" (Genesis 9:13). The covenant God refers to is that He would never again flood the whole earth as He had done. He told Noah that, every time he saw a rainbow, he could know that God had established a covenant with "all flesh that is on the earth" (verse 17).

The wording of Genesis 9 is interesting in that God says the rainbow will be a reminder for Himself to remember His covenant: "When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh. And the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth" (Genesis 9:14–16). This does not imply that God "needs" reminding; it is simply a way of saying that God will faithfully keep His covenant. He is ever mindful of His promise. The covenant is perpetual, enduring to all generations. Never again will there be a worldwide flood

During this month, you will see a lot of rainbows that certain groups have adopted as their logo, but remember, the rainbow represents God's covenant to mankind and His creation as well as a reminder of His promise and His faithfulness!

Several months ago a friend showed the movie Before the Wrath at our OWLD Tuesday Bible Study. The film explains how proposals and weddings were done during Biblical times. The man, in proposing to the woman, would offer her a chalice of wine. If she sipped from the cup, she was accepting his proposal and they were betrothed. The groom would then return to his father's house to build on a room and make preparations to receive his new wife there, where they would then make their home together. When all the work was completed, he waited for the time of his father's approval before he could go get his bride. Only the father knew when that time would be.

What clarity knowing this practice gives to Matthew 24:36 where Jesus says "No one knows about the day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." Truly, only the Father knows! Jesus also cautions us in vs 42, to remain alert for this time: "Therefore keep watch; because you do not know on what day Your Lord will come."

As we enter the month of June, let's enjoy the beauty of the season, and be mindful the Son is waiting the Father's permission to come and get His bride. Be on the watch, be ready because the greatest wedding celebration will be happening - soon, we hope!


